

Mathematics:

Counting reliably with numbers 1-20, placing them in order and saying which number is one more or one less than a given number.

Using quantities and objects children add and subtract two single digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer.

Solving problems including doubling, sharing and halving.

Using everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, distance, time and money.

Exploring the characteristics of everyday objects and shapes and using mathematical language to describe them.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Taking account of others ideas.

Being sensitive to others' needs and feelings.

Explaining why they like some activities more than others.

Adjusting behaviour to different situations.

Literacy:

Reading and understanding simple sentences.

Using phonic knowledge to decode regular words and reading them out loud accurately.

Reading tricky words.

Demonstrating understanding about what they have read.

Writing regular and irregular words.

Writing simple sentences that can be read by themselves and others.

Physical development:

Showing good co-ordination, moving confidently and handling equipment effectively.

Knowing the importance of good health - understanding what is healthy and unhealthy.

Communication and Language:

Listening to stories, anticipating key events, expressing views about why things happen.

Expressive arts and design:

Singing songs and making music.

Using a variety of tools and materials to create designs and learning how to talk about them.

Representing ideas through role play.
